

## **Protect our rivers**

We need your help to <a href="mailto:stop-paint">stop paint</a> getting in our awa.



<u>Never</u> tip paint or clean up water onto <u>driveways or</u> <u>into gutters</u>. It kills our rivers, harbour and ocean.

This is the environmental damage caused from just one painter cleaning their buckets on a driveway in Porirua.





## You should know

- We all need to protect and take care of our environment.
- It is illegal to put paint into our waterways and the stormwater system.

You can be fined up to \$1,000, issued abatement notices, or prosecuted and fined up to \$600,000 for breaching the Resource Management Act.

## How to clean your equipment

- NEVER wash off painting equipment on a driveway, gutter or where it will flow to a stormwater drain or natural watercourse.
- NEVER pour surplus paint down a drain. The Resene Colour Shop on Lyttelton Avenue, Porirua accepts useable leftover Resene paint to donate to community groups. Dulux also have a paint takeback programme. Alternatively, paint can be left to dry hard and disposed of with solid waste.
- Water-based paint equipment CAN be washed in sinks that go to a council sewer system, such as a laundry sink (not a septic system or stormwater) or on an unsealed surface such as a lawn or gravel area well away from gutters and waterways.

## How paint damages our waterways

Paints and thinners contain a number of harmful substances that severely affect our waterways. The impact of these include:

- Poisoning animals that drink from or live in the stream.
- Restricting light entering a stream.
- Smothering organisms and clogging the gills and eyes of fish.
- Reducing oxygen levels in waterways, making fish and shellfish unsuitable for consumption, and killing plant and animal aquatic life.
